

Dr Abena Yeboaa Tannor is a Family Physician specialist who established the first locally-led multidisciplinary Rehabilitation Medicine service in Ghana at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital. She helped develop the curriculum for a 2-year fellowship program in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. Her clinical responsibilities include providing inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services as well as working with orthotists in her team to develop affordable and accessible assistive devices using local raw materials.

Dr Tannor received her medical education at the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology following it up with a Masters' degree in Rehabilitation from the St George's University of London. She is a member of the Ghana College of Physicians and a 2017 UK Alumni Award and Mandela Washington Fellowship finalist.

She is also a member of the Fogarty Global Health Fellowship Program's Primary Faculty, the editorial board of the International Journal of Therapy and Rehabilitation(IJTR), International Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine(ISPRM) and an active member of ISPRM's working group on Rehabilitation workforce capacity building in low and middle income countries, having conducted research into rehabilitation in developing countries particularly Ghana.
