

Masami Akai is a board-certificated specialist of rehabilitation medicine and orthopaedic surgery, and is now Vice-dean and Professor of the Graduate School, International University of Health and Welfare.

He graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Tokyo in 1974, and received the Degree of D. Med. Sci. from the Graduate School of Medicine, University of Tokyo in 1984. He has also the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) Certificate.

After postgraduate training, he had career of several academic and hospital appointments, and had been the director of National Rehabilitation Center Hospital until 3 years before. He is currently the President of the Asia-Oceania Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine.

He is an honorary member of the Japanese Association of Rehabilitation Medicine and currently a member of Board of Directors or a councilor of several domestic Societies, and a member of the Scientific Committee of the International Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine.

His interesting fields are spinal cord injury and its plasticity, amputation/prosthesis and orthosis, gait analysis/biomechanics, joint contracture, and biophysical modulation of tissue repair. He has several scientific publications on the topics described above in the international journals of rehabilitation medicine and other related peer-reviewed journals.
