Lynette currently serves as the Research Programme Coordinator for the World Federation of Occupational Therapists (WFOT) and is currently Australia's Second Delegate to the WFOT (Past Delegate). Lynette obtained her doctoral degree at the University of Newcastle (Australia) under the supervision of Professor Julie Byles, a leader in gerontology epidemiological research.

Lynette's research programmes focus on chronic disease and the needs of an older population. Lynette leads research exploring allied health and occupational therapy clinical practice addressing a range of clinical problems relevant to everyday practice and building the research capacity of clinicians in my network. My goal is to extend and transform research in ageing, falls prevention, the long-term effects of cancer treatment (such as fatigue, cognitive issues, psychosocial needs), return to work following disability and developing new models of service delivery in primary care by health professionals.
