Astrid van Wieringen is full professor at Experimental Otorinolaryngology, Dept Neurosciences, University of Leuven (Belgium) where she combines research and teaching. Her interdisciplinary research focuses on hearing and hearing care, for children and adults with listening difficulties without hearing impairment, with hearing aids or with cochlear implants. She has published about 150 articles in internationally reviewed scientific journals and 12 book chapter (h-index is 37, WOS). During the academic year she teaches 5 courses within the faculty of Medicine and faculty of Science of the University of Leuven.

She is the chair of the International Policy Council of the University of Leuven, and was the former program director of Speech Pathology and Audiology. Astrid is actively involved in the World Rehabilitation Alliance, working group on Education through the International Society of Audiology, and member of the working group on recommendations and good clinical practice for hearing aids (chaired by HTAnalysts, Sydney, Australia). Over the past 30 years she has co-organized numerous national and international conferences, and performed several editorial functions.

She is secretary-treasurer of the International Collegium of Rehabilitative Audiology (ICRA), (founding) board member of the Belgian Scientific society of Audiology (B Audio), and president of the International Society of Audiology from September 2024.
