Joann Starks, M. Ed., served as a senior technical assistance consultant at American Institutes for Research (AIR) from 2015-2025. Starks worked with the Center on Knowledge Translation for Disability and Rehabilitation Research (2012-2025) and from 2010-2020 with the Center on Knowledge Translation for Employment Research. Both Centers are funded by the National Institute on Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research. She also serves as Cochair of the Disability Coordinating Group of the international Campbell Collaboration (2017-present). Starks was awarded the John Westbrook Award for Contributions to Knowledge Translation by Campbell in October 2020.
