Kathleen Murphy is a managing researcher at the American Institutes for Research. She currently directs the Center on Knowledge Translation for Disability and Rehabilitation Research and was also the director of the Center on Knowledge Translation for Employment Research from 2016-2021, both funded by the National Institute on Disability, Independent Living and Rehabilitation Research, a center in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service's Administration for Community Living. She has over 20 years' experience developing, managing, executing and disseminating findings from research projects. Prior to joining AIR, she was an Assistant Research Professor at Baylor University, a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Notre Dame, and an IIE Fulbright Scholar at the University of Guadalajara. She has published on a range of topics such as how to support cancer survivors in the workplace, including co-authoring a Campbell Collaboration systematic review, and co-authored a 2021 update of two prior Campbell Collaboration reviews on employment interventions to support the employment outcomes of people with autism. Kathleen holds a PhD in Social Anthropology from the University of Texas at Austin, where she also did postdoctoral work in the School of Social Work. She also holds an MA in Theology from the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, California and a bachelor's degree in History and Literature from Harvard University. She serves as co-chair of the Campbell Collaboration's Knowledge Translation and Implementation Coordinating Group and is an expert advisor to the World Health Organization's 2024 initiative to develop a global research agenda on knowledge translation. She was vice president of NARRTC (formerly known as the National Association of Rehabilitation Research and Training Centers) from 2016-2017, served on its Executive Committee from 2019-2024, and since 2022 has been chair of its Knowledge Translation Committee.
