Alan Jette PT, Ph.D. has gained an international reputation for his research into the evaluation of rehabilitation outcomes, functional measurement, and the prevention of disability.

He is recognized for the advancement and dissemination of item response theory (IRT) outcome measurement instruments designed to evaluate health care quality and outcomes. He has served as Dean of Boston University's Sargent College of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences and for 15 years was Director of the Boston University Post-Doctoral Fellowship Program in Outcomes Research.

Other indications of Dr. Jette's impact on rehabilitation research comes from his participation in the NIH's Blue Ribbon Panel on Medical Rehabilitation Research and his chairing the Institute of Medicine's study that resulted in the 2007 report, "The Future of Disability in America," which highlighted disability priorities for the United States.

In 2013, Dr. Jette was elected to the prestigious National Academy of Medicine, formerly the Institute of Medicine. He serves as Professor of Health Lay, Policy, and Management at the Boston University School of Public Health and Professor of Rehabilitation Sciences at the MGH Institute of Health Professions. He is Editor-in-Chief of the journal PHYSICAL THERAPY.
